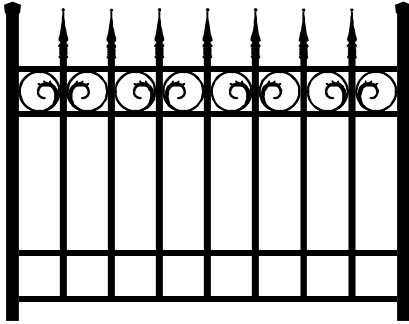


“...good fences make good neighbors...”
